

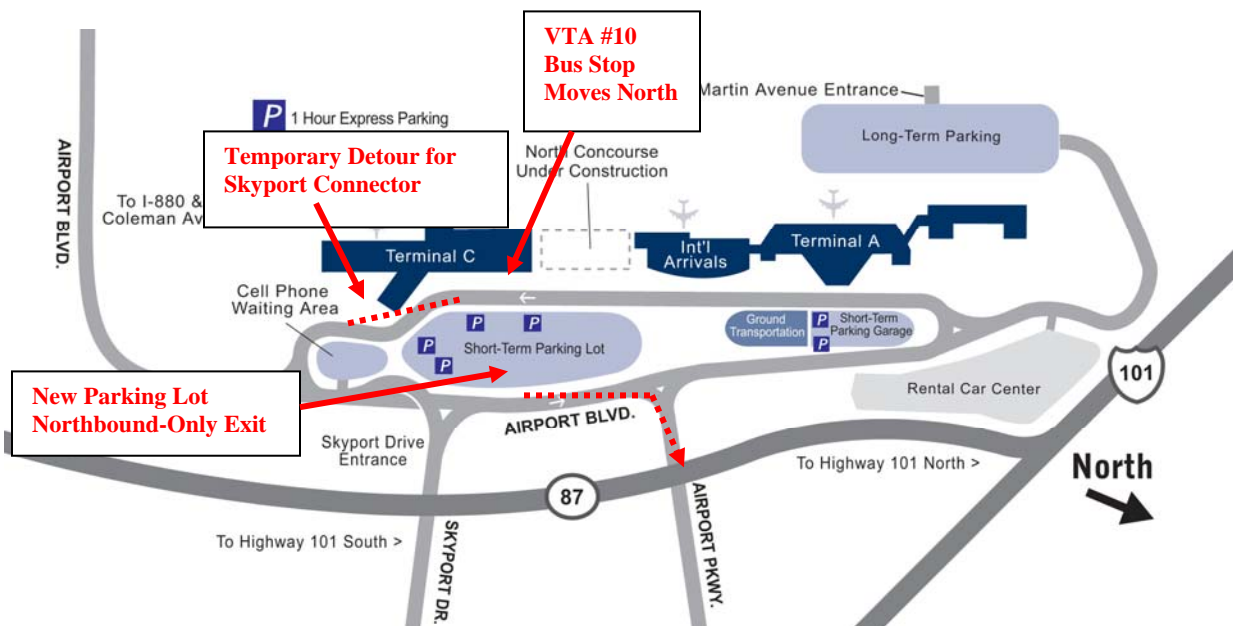
Airport Construction Update #3 Week of August 20, 2007

Construction Begins on Temporary Skyport Connector near Terminal C

On Thursday night, August 23, we will switch traffic to a temporary detour near the Terminal C baggage claim area. This change will allow us to build the temporary Skyport Connector over the next several weeks. Construction will be done at night to minimize impacts on traffic, and the actual construction area is located outside existing roadways. The Skyport Connector, which is currently scheduled to be open to traffic in late September or early October, will shorten the southern end of the terminal loop road and allow us to make changes to roadways and parking areas.

New Exit for Terminal C Short-Term Parking Lot

On Friday, August 24, we will open the new exit for the new Terminal C parking lot, and close the current exit at the south end of the lot. In this new configuration, exiting vehicles will merge on to northbound Airport Boulevard, and they can leave the Airport via Airport Parkway that takes you to North First Street. This change is required by the construction of the Skyport Connector, which will block off the southern exit.



Cell Phone Waiting Lot Remains Open until September 5

The schedule for Airport roadway construction has been adjusted so that we can keep the cell phone waiting area open through the Labor Day holiday.

VTA Route 10 "Airport Flyer" Bus Stop Relocated at Terminal C

The VTA bus stop at Terminal C is now at the north end of Terminal C, near Alaska Airlines departures. This is the only stop at Terminal C for VTA Route 10, the "Airport Flyer," that provides a convenient public transit shuttle connecting the Airport to VTA Light Rail Metro Station on North First Street and the Santa Clara Train Station. Schedule are not affected.

Blue Shuttle Bus Stop Relocated at Terminal C

The pick-up location for the Airport's blue shuttle buses is now across the street from Baggage Claim at Terminal C. This is the only location at Terminal C for blue bus pick-up and drop-off. This move includes shuttle bus services for long-term parking, rental car, inter-terminal, and employee parking routes.

No Gate Changes at Terminal C This Week

Over the next two weeks, we don't expect any temporary changes to Terminal C airline gates. Construction on the airfield will require airlines at Terminal C to relocate their usual gates from time to time in the coming months, however. Travelers still need to be alert to potential gate changes, and, as always, allow a few more minutes in your travel plans to adjust.
